ABOUT THE HALIFAX RIVER YACHT CLUB

HRYC was started over 120 years ago by thirteen Daytona sailors who loved racing their gaff-rigged catboats on the Halifax River. Back in 1896, they built their clubhouse on a wharf 150 feet long and 8 feet wide, across from property owned by Laurence Thompson, one of the founders. Over the years, the original club house grew and more docks were added as members discovered the good times to be had along the Halifax River.

HUNGRY BOATERS

If you arrive after lunch hours, just see the bartender for a choice of cold sandwiches or a salads.

BAR OR LOUNGE

Beverages are available from 11:00 a.m. until closing. Drinks sold at the Club may only be consumed in the Clubhouse and on contiguous Club property.

Join our members for a drink at the Tiki bar or upstairs in the Flag Room and Deck. The view of the harbor from there is spectacular! End your evening with a delicious dinner in the Flag Room. Either the receptionist or the bartender will be glad to make reservations for you.

NO MINORS ARE ALLOWED AT THE BAR.

CELL PHONES/ COMMUNICATION DEVICE

Cell phones are PROHIBITED in the club house, please put your COMMUNICATION DEVICES IN THE SILENT MODE AND RECEIVE CALLS OUTSIDE.

SHIP'S STORE

Enjoy shopping from 11:00 am to 8:00 pm. The front desk will be glad to help you!

DRESS

Lunch – Casual dress – shorts, sports or boating attire may be worn in the Flag Room at lunchtime.

Dinner – Casual dress [Jacket and tie optional] except for special events. *No one permitted in Clubhouse without shirt and shoes or in a bathing suit.*

Gentlemen, please, no hats/caps permitted inside any Club dining room or at the bar.

IDENTIFICATION

Visitors must identify themselves by presenting a current membership card from their club.

RECIPROCITY

Florida Council of Yacht Club (FCYC) members, and American Yacht Clubs will receive reciprocity.

GRATUITIES

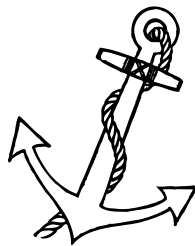
A voluntary gratuity is added to all food and bar checks unless otherwise stated by guest. If you wish, an additional tip may be given to your server.

PAYMENT

FCYC member's bills will be sent to their club. Out of state or non-FCYC members may pay with credit cards.

CAR ARRIVAL

From I-4 or I-95, exit at U.S. 92 east. Drive east on International Speedway Blvd. (U.S. 92); turn right onto S. Beach Street (before the river). We are located 2 stoplights down, corner of Beach and Orange Ave., on the south side of the Fire Station. Parking can be found on the south side of fire station parking lot or across the street (corner of Live Oak and Beach Street).

DOCKMASTER

DOCKAGE

Due to limited space, visiting yachts should call the Dockmaster (386)-290-9454 for slip reservations. Yachts racing the Gulfstreamer receive complimentary dockage and may be rafted to other vessels.

MARINA

Up to 80' LOA vessels may dock at HRYC and three transient's slips are available. A 37-foot floating dock for smaller boats adjoins the seawall. The Dockmaster is on duty Monday through Sunday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and may be reached on VHF Ch. 68 or at (386) 290-9454. Showers, ice and laundry facilities are available at the Clubhouse.

BOAT ARRIVAL

The Yacht Club is located adjacent to the Halifax Marina just south of the Memorial Bridge (Orange Ave.) on the west side of the Halifax River. Long/Lat. N.29° 12' 30" W 81° 1' 0". The channel is narrow but well marked. At low tide it can be shallow.

Advance reservations for dockage are a **must**. Check out time is 12:00 noon. If this is not convenient, you may make arrangements with the Dockmaster.

DOCKS

Docks must be kept free and clear at all times. Please coil lines, power lines and hoses neatly.

NO OPEN FIRES OR BAR-B-QUES ON WOOD DOCKS!!!!

REPAIRS

Non-members are not permitted to employ anyone other than members of their own crew for minor repairs and maintenance while docked at the Club, except in emergencies. Arrangements for other work must be made with local boat yards or approved on site contractors, please see the Dockmaster for assistance.

FUEL and PUMP OUT STATIONS AT NEARBY MARINAS

NEARBY ANCHORAGES

There is good deep water west of marker 44.

VEHICLES

A dock cart for transporting bulky gear is available from the Dockmaster. No gas or electric vehicles are permitted to operate on the docks.

WASTE

Garbage and trash must be tied in plastic bags and deposited in containers ashore. A receptacle is provided at the dock entrance and the entrance to the parking lot.

BLOCK ICE - Halifax Harbor Marina: Left (S) on Beach Street Left (E) at first light onto Basin St. HRYC Dockmaster has cube ice.

PETS

All pets must be on a leash when ashore. Pets, except for service dogs, are not allowed in the clubhouse or Tiki area. There is a dog walk area on the south side of the docks. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets.

ABOUT HISTORIC DAYTONA



If you want to stretch your legs, walk (or shop) your way north up Beach Street into the restored Historic Downtown. Enjoy the unusual Art Deco buildings, browse through the unique shops and antique malls, and if time allows, inspect the auto racing memorabilia at the Halifax Museum. A favorite with most boaters is touring Angell and Phelps and watching chocolates made by hand the old fashioned way. Don't miss it, chocolate is almost a cruising necessity. And it's on the way back to the boat!

Go north of Club on S. Beach Street and take a left on Magnolia Ave. (Open Saturday mornings).

PUBLIC LIBRARY

1 block North, East of S. Beach Street or take a short cut through the Farmer's Market and Library parking lot. If you want "take with you books" there is a used book store on S. Beach Street and a huge one, Abraxas Books, one block West of Beach at 127 International Speedway Blvd. West.
